Beginning of School Year	<p>Parents Right to Know – Educator Qualifications: Parents of all children attending Title I-A schools be notified at the beginning of each school year that they can request information on the professional qualifications of the student’s classroom teachers including:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • whether the student’s teacher <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ has met State qualification and licensing criteria for the grade levels and subject areas in which the teacher provides instruction; ○ is teaching under emergency or other provisional status through which State qualification or licensing criteria have been waived; and ○ is teaching in the field of discipline of the certification of the teacher; and • whether the child is provided services by paraprofessionals, and, if so, their qualifications.
Beginning of School Year	<p>Parents Right to Know – Assessments: At the beginning of each school year, the district must provide each parent of each student attending any Title I-A school information on the level of achievement of the parent’s child in each of the state academic assessments; notified the parents of each student attending any Title I-A school that the parents may request information regarding any State or district policy regarding student participation in any assessments mandated by the State or district, which shall include a policy, procedure, or parental right to opt the child out of such assessment; and made widely available through public means (including by posting in a clear and easily accessible manner on the district’s website) information on each assessment required by the State to comply with section 1111 including —</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • the subject matter assessed; • the purpose for which the assessment is designed and used; • the source of the requirement for the assessment; and • where such information is available— the amount of time students will spend taking the assessment; the schedule for the assessment; and the time and format for disseminating results.
February	Title I Comparability Report due for required districts only (exact due date varies)
Mid-February	Districts must publicly disseminate district and school report cards to all parents of students in school within 30 days of report cards going live
Annual	Each Title I School shall convene a Title I Meeting
Annual	Schoolwide Waiver due (as applicable)
Periodic Review	Districts must periodically review and revise the following plans as necessary: District Plan, Schoolwide Plan (as applicable), Targeted Assistance Plan (as
